#### PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

- 1. The Claimant is the owner of buildings located at the University of Sussex campus which includes the Library premises, Sussex House (the University's central administration building), the Innovation Centre (which houses various technology businesses with links to academic aspects of the University occupying units within the building) and Bramber House (which includes the University's business and conference centre). The Innovation Centre is leased to Sussex Innovation Centre Limited, which is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Claimant, set up to manage the Innovation Centre.
- 2. On or about 15 November 2006 the Claimant received a communication from a person identifying himself as Nick MacGowan. The document was addressed to all the University of Sussex Library staff and confirmed that a number of students would be occupying the Library in support of the "Sort us out" campaign and as a protest against tuition fees, on Tuesday 28 November 2006. The notification invited contact to be made in order for a meeting to be arranged. The

contact details were given for Nick MacGowan care of an e-mail address of <a href="mailto:SvenMacGowan@yahoo.co.uk">SvenMacGowan@yahoo.co.uk</a>. The Claimant has been told that the name "Nick MacGowan" is a collective identity for the organisers of the intended Library occupation and continues it's attempts by e-mail correspondence to meet with the protestors with a view to avoiding the threatened occupation.

- 3. The threatened occupation of the library would constitute a trespass to land.
- 4. The threatened actions of the Defendants also constitute an interference with the lawful business of the Claimant insofar as the Library, Sussex house, the Innovation Centre and Bramber House are key administrative buildings and service centres used in connection with the business of the University.
- 5. The Claimant believes that the Defendants will carry out their threats to occupy the library and possibly other buildings at the University of Sussex unless restrained by Order of the Court. This belief is supported by the fact that there have been a number of recent incidents involving occupation of the University buildings including the occupation of the Innovation Centre in May 2006.
- 6. The Claimant is unable to sufficiently identify the Defendants to effect service of the proceedings. It is believed that if notice were to be given to Nick MacGowan, as representative for the Defendants (by email or otherwise), in advance of an injunction being sought this would accelerate the intended occupation of the building.

#### WITNESS STATEMENT OF TINA REBECCA GEORGE

- I, Tina Rebecca George, of 100 Queens Road, Brighton, East Sussex, BN1 3YB, will say as follows:-
- I am a Partner of DMH Stallard, Solicitors for the University of Sussex. The 1. matters referred to in this witness statement are based on information given to me by Philip Harvey, Registrar of the University of Sussex, by e-mail and telephone. On this basis I believe the contents of this statement to be true. There is now produced and shown to me an exhibit bundle marked "TRG1" containing true copies of documents which I will refer to by page number during the course of this statement.
- 2. This statement is made in support of an application by the University for an injunction against persons unknown. At page 1 of TRG1 appears the note received by the University of Sussex from a person identifying himself as Nick

MacGowan. The note sets out the proposed occupation of the Library by students in support of the "Sort us out" campaign and as a protest against tuition fees on 28 November 2006. A response was sent to Mr MacGowan at the stated e-mail address on 17 November 2006 (see page 2 of TRG1) to ascertain its authenticity and requesting confirmation that the recipient of that e-mail was in fact the author of the letter. A response was received to that e-mail on 20 November (page 3 of TRG1) confirming that Nick MacGowan is the collective identity for the organisers of the Library occupation. It confirms that the occupation is not negotiable with the University Management or it's lawyers.

- 3. The University believes that the occupation of the library, and possibly other buildings, will proceed as planned on 28 November 2006. There have been a number of previous incidents where buildings have been occupied on the campus as a student protest, most recently the Innovation Centre that was occupied in May 2006.
- 4. The University continues to attempt to negotiate with the students concerned to see if the intended protest can be avoided. A further e-mail was sent to Mr MacGowan on 22 November 2006 proposing that a meeting be held between University staff and the protestors on either 23 or 24 November. At the time of making this statement it is not known whether the protesters will agree to meet and whether the protest can be avoided.
- 5. If the occupation goes ahead then this will severely interrupt the lawful business of the University. Although the Library has been specifically mentioned by the students, it is anticipated that this could easily extend to other buildings on the University campus including Sussex House, the Innovation Centre and Bramber House, all of which are key administrative buildings and service centres of the University.
- 6. The University seeks an injunction in the terms of the application. It recognises that if the Court grants such an application it will not be effective until it is

brought to the knowledge of the individuals who intend to occupy. The Claimant is seeking the Court's permission to allow service by an alternative method pursuant to CPR 6.8. It is proposed that service of the Claim Form and related proceedings is effected by fixing these documents to the entrances to the Library and any other buildings falling within the parameters of the Injunction Order granted, and in addition by scanning and sending copies of the proceedings and Orders to svenmacgowan@yahoo.co.uk. The Claimant wishes to serve the documents by the method stated above and for service to be deemed within 12 hours of the documents being attached to the entrances.

7. The application for an injunction order is made without notice to the defendants. The Claimant genuinely believes that if advance notice is given about the proceedings this will precipitate the protest being brought forward to an earlier date.

UPON hearing Counsel for the Claimant

AND UPON the Claimant, by it's Counsel, undertaking to the Court to pay any damages which the Defendants (or any other parties served with or notified of this Order) a stay in which the Court considers the Claimant should pay then

#### IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- The Defendants be prohibited from trespassing on the Claimant's property by entering the Library, Sussex House, the Innovation Centre and Bramber Close at the University of Sussex in connection with any protest or campaign;
- 2. The Defendants be prohibited from engaging in conduct such as to constitute an interference with the lawful business use of the

Claimant, by occupying the Library, Sussex House, the Innovation Centre and Bramber Close at the University of Sussex and be prohibited from entering them;

3. Pursuant to CPR 6.8 service of the Claim Form, Form N16A, Witness Statement of Tina George and Exhibit and Order be permitted by the affixing of the documents to the entrances to the Library, Sussex House, the Innovation Centre and Bramber House, and by sending copies by email to svenMacGowan@yahoo.co.uk and that service will be deemed when the documents are so posted or sent.

4. Costs.

IF A PERSON TO WHOM THIS ORDER RELATES, AND WHO HAS KNOWLEDGE OF IT, DISOBEYS THE ORDER THEY MAY BE HELD TO BE IN CONTEMPT OF COURT AND MAY BE IMPRISONED, FINED OR HAVE THEIR ASSETS SEIZED.
