Jewish and non-Jewish celebrities and comedians will perform at the show **60 Years – What a State!** in London on 8th May 2008, the same night as the Zionist Federation stages its Israel 60 gala a few miles away in Wembley.

By supporting our event, you will show that you believe that there can be peace with justice in Israel/Palestine – that two peoples can share one future – and you will have a great night out!

Money raised from **60 Years – What a State!** will go to:

- B'Tselem, the Israeli Centre for Human Rights in the Occupied Territories.

- The National Coalition of Anti-Deportation Campaigns, which supports refugees and asylum seekers in Britain.

The show has been organised by the **Jewish Socialists' Group**, which opposes Israel's occupation of Palestinian land, supports Israelis and Palestinians campaigning for peace and justice, and fights against racism and for equality for all, whether in the diaspora or in Israel/Palestine.
